


Overview of implementation of the 2019-2030 Program for Public Health Protection and Health Care System Development "Healthy person - prosperous country" for the 2019-2020 period




Average life expectancy, 2010-2020 (years)




Birth Rate, Mortality, Natural Growth (per 1000 population)





Public Health & Prevention

- A number of laws and regulations have been developed and adopted;
- Regulatory documents (sanitary and epidemiological rules and regulations, standards for various operating procedures) related to COVID-19 have been enacted;
- The information & communication strategy was developed, aimed at reducing the consumption of salt, trans fats, tobacco and alcohol, as well as increasing physical activity among the population;
- The National Healthy Cities Network of the Kyrgyz Republic was created;
- The restructuring of Public Health Service was carried out (there were 51 DP&SSES Centers, 19 ID DP&SSES Centers and 1 SSES Center, 1 SSESNT Center)

Strengthening of intersectoral collaboration, support of the work of the Coordination Commissions in the KR regions, districts and cities

(Regional consultations)

In 2019:

- Changes have been entered to the Resolution of the KR Government "On Public Health Coordination Council under the KR Government" No. 352 dated June 26, 2014 (Resolution of the GoKR No 410 dated August 20, 2019)
- Model Regulations were developed for the Coordination Commission for Public Health Protection in regions, districts and cities of the Kyrgyz Republic, where the Scope of Work of the Commissions include onsite monitoring and evaluation of implementation of national, state and sectoral programs (GoKR Resolution No 458 dated September 6, 2019)



Primary Health Care

- PHC has played a significant role in the fight against COVID-19 pandemic in the country. In Bishkek, in all the Regional FMCs 7 Call Centers were launched to provide remote medical advice on COVID-19 for the population of the country;
- Necessary equipment was purchased for PHC health care organizations to organize telemedicine consultations and distance education of health workers, with the support of partners;
- Mobile teams have been established with engagement of PHC doctors, epidemiologists, nurses to ensure patronage;
- The PHC Task Force was established with the mandate to formulate and implement the policy on ensuring universal access to PHC;
- Implementation of the Program to improve the PHC services quality has begun.

HCOs' Infrastructure



- The Kyrgyz-Turkish Friendship Hospital has begun to receive patients (TICA);
- The construction of 3 experimental pre-fabricated infectious diseases hospitals in the cities of Bishkek, Osh and Naryn and major repairs of 9 facilities in the republic have been completed. (Social Partnership Fund for Regional Development)

With the support of the German Development Bank (KfW):


- A new Emergency Care department was put into operation in the Jalal-Abad Regional Clinical Hospital, Jalal-Abad City;
- The Perinatal Center construction is at the stage of completion in Bishkek;
- Work has begun on construction of Perinatal Centers in the cities of Osh and Talas;
- Construction of a new City TB Hospital has begun in Bishkek

Government spending on health care in 2020



Inventory of the KR legislation in Health care area (Decree of the KR President "On conducting the inventory of the KR legislation" dated 08.02.2021, Order of the GoKR No. 55-p dated 10.03.2021)

Key findings after the review of the laws:

- The Law of the Kyrgyz Republic "On Protection of Citizens' Health" contains many provisions, which are duplicated in other specific laws on healthcare
- In the Program for public health protection for 2019-2030 "Healthy person prosperous country" it is noted that "The laws, governing public relations in the field of health (sectoral laws) each have their own goals and objectives, play a very significant role in achieving the common social objective providing a legal framework for protecting the health of citizens, but for the most part they are practically not interlinked with each other, and also contain overlapping norms."
- Considering that one of the objectives of the legislation inventory is to reduce the number of regulatory legal acts by identifying excessive legal regulation of the issue, it is advisable to systematize regulatory legal acts in health sector.
